Phonological Processes: sound law universal set of hierarchically ordered procedures used by children to simplify speech Stamp sees phonological

development as a gradual loss of these simplifying processes until the child's words finally match their adult models Substitutions: comparing adult ...

More specific patterns of bilingual phonological development have been identified by Goldstein (2001) With a small sample of children of Puerto Rican descent, Goldstein (2001) found that by four years of age, the only sounds this group of normally developing bilingual children produced with less than 90% accuracy were fricatives and affricates
